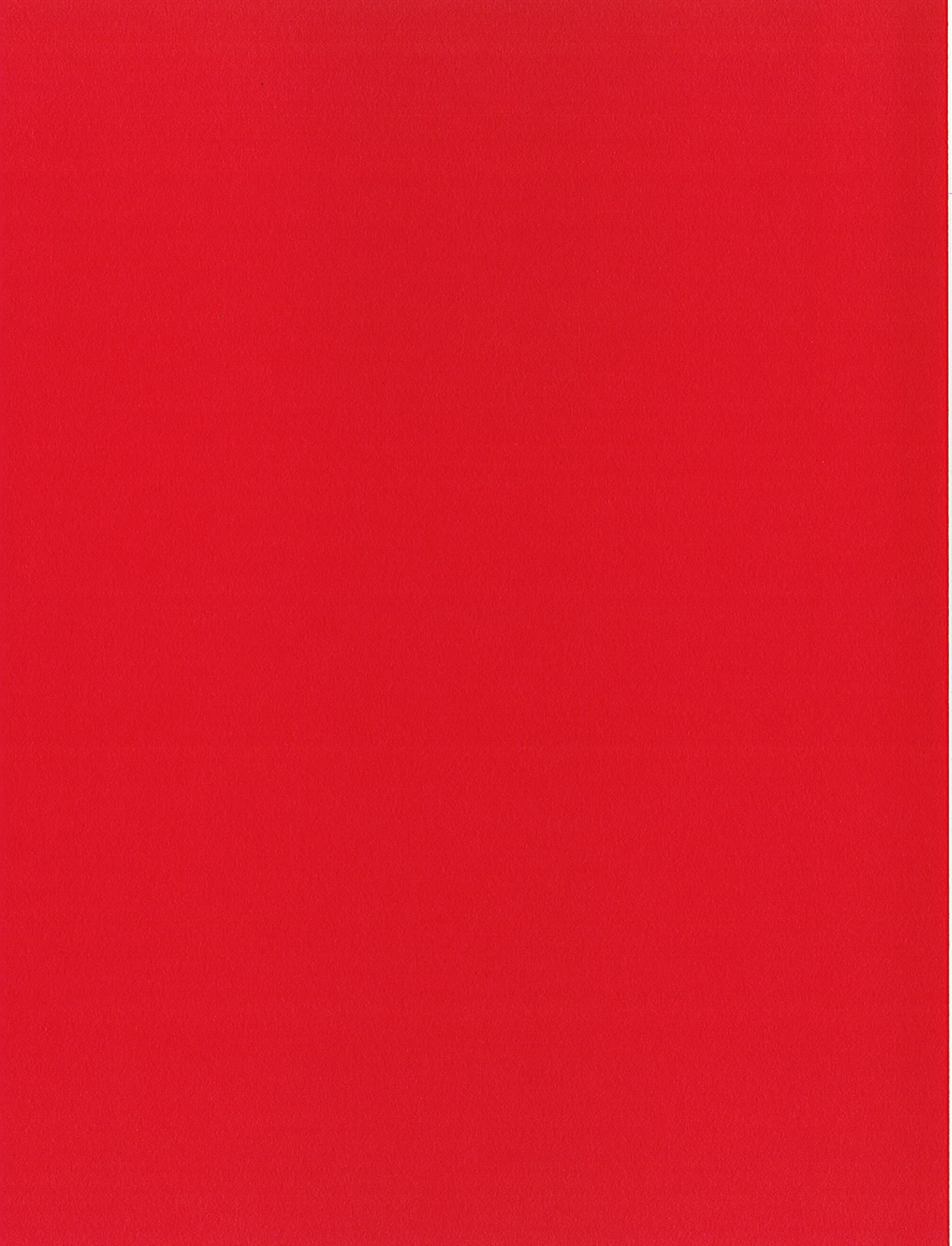

Minutes

June 5, 2014

West Kendall Baptist Hospital

President, **Cindy Lerner**, Mayor, Village of Pinecrest, called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. and welcomed the guest to the West Kendall Baptist Hospital. Rabbi **Jaime Klein Aklepi**, Senior Rabbi, Temple Bet Breira gave the Invocation. Commissioner **Sally Heyman**, Miami-Dade County led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The **municipalities represented** at the Board Meeting: Biscayne Park, Doral, El Portal, Indian Creek, Homestead, Medley, Miami Beach, Miami Lakes North Miami, North Miami Beach, Opa-Locka, Palmetto Bay, Pinecrest, South Miami, Virginia Gardens and West Miami. **Associate Members** and guests: Baptist Health South Florida, C.A.P. Government, Inc., Carter Outdoor, CH2M Hill, Chen Moore and Associates, Greater Miami Convention and Visitors Bureau, Kimley-Horn and Associates, Levy and Associates, Marrero and Wydler, The Corradino Group, Waste Pro USA and Waste Management

President **Lerner** asked for a motion to approve the minutes and the consent agenda. The motion passed by a unanimous vote.

President **Lerner** introduced **Ralph Rios**, Vice President, Professional Services for the Baptist Health South Florida presentation. Mr. Rios welcomed the members present to the West Kendall Baptist Hospital. He informed everyone that the West Kendall Baptist Hospital is the first new non-replacement hospital in Miami-Dade County in nearly 40 years. Mr. Rios mentioned how the new concept is to have a healthy community and not just making patients better. Mr. Rios introduced **Michelle Mejia**, Assistant Vice President, Physician Services and GME to give the members more information on how they would like to better the community. Ms. Mejia welcomed everyone the new facility. She informed everyone that West Kendall Baptist Hospital was established by the results that they received from the community needs assessment report. The community would like for West Kendall Baptist Hospital to concentrate on five top priorities. The top five priorities are access to care, access to primary care, heart disease, chronic disease management and healthy life styles. Ms. Mejia mentioned that West

Kendall Baptist Hospital is addressing these priorities. Baptist Health South Florida developed its Wellness Advantage program in 2000. It is the cornerstone of our commitment to improving the health and well being of our employees and their families. Ms. Mejia informed that they created a Worksite Solutions as an outgrowth of this program because they believe that good health is integral to business success. This means ensuring that your employees are able to do their best work, enjoy their personal and professional lives and help keep your company's healthcare costs under control. Ms. Mejia presented a video for the members to watch regarding the Baptist Health South Florida helping the community. Ms. Mejia introduced Jose C. Romano, Assistant Vice President, Business and Community Relations to conclude the Baptist Health South Florida presentation. Mr. Romano thanked everyone for attending the Board of Directors meeting and thanked the League for allowing them to host the June BOD meeting.

President **Lerner** introduced **Gil Ziffer**, Commissioner, City of Tallahassee. Commissioner Ziffer informed everyone that he is running for 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President of the Florida League of Cities. Commissioner Ziffer also informed everyone that he has been in the City of Tallahassee Commission for five years and he has served in the Florida League of Cities Board for two years. It is very important for me to become a second Vice President for the Florida League of Cities and I will work harder than everyone can and make my efforts for the entire community. Commissioner Ziffer mentioned how he is available to speak to anyone that has questions for him. He asked for support as candidate for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President of the Florida League of Cities.

The motion passed by a unanimous vote.

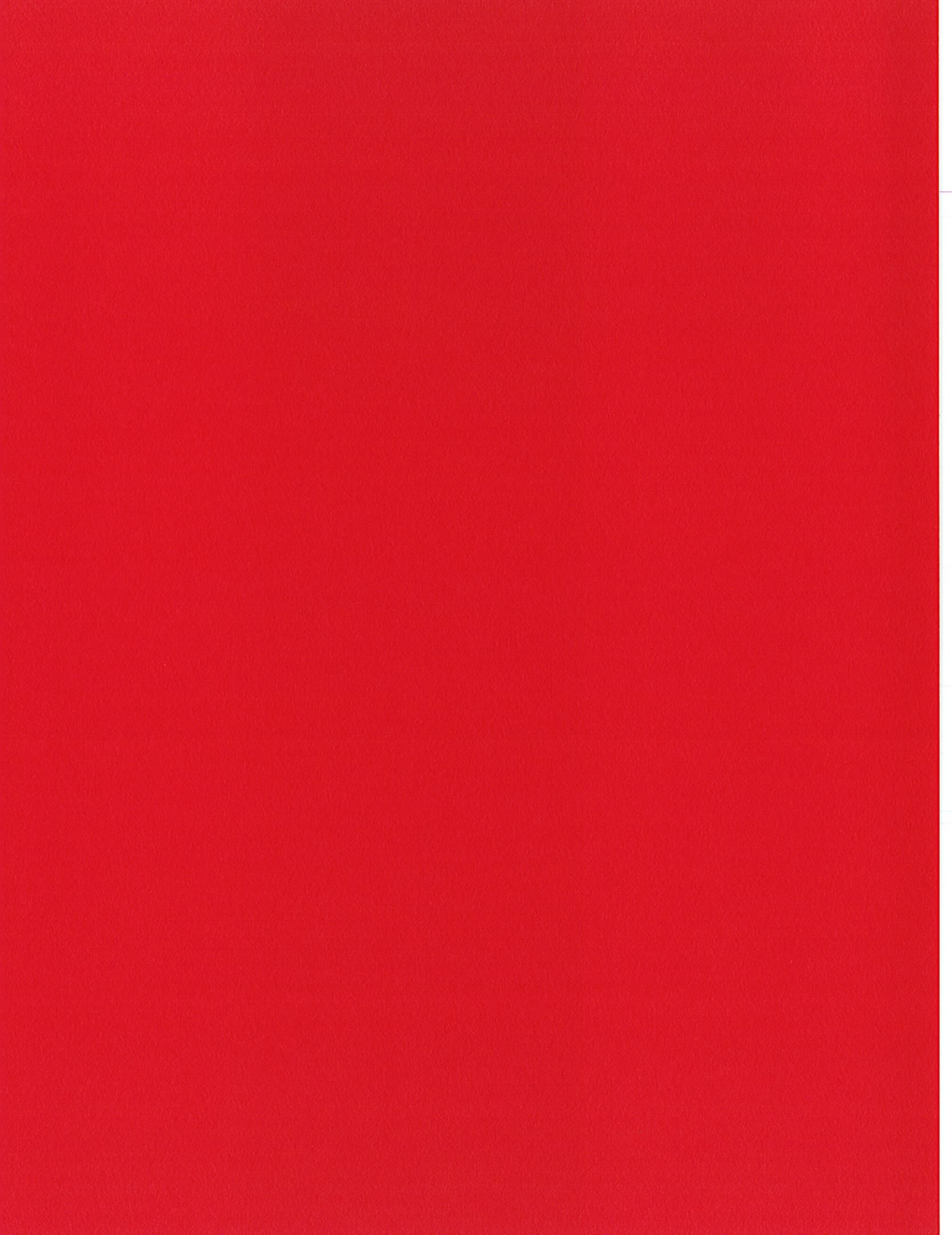
